| <input type="checkbox"/> | 1- <u>Dog Walker:</u> Assist in the socialization of dogs available for adoption by walking them in a specified area. Volunteers are encouraged to interact with dogs by talking, brushing, and playful contact. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | 2- <u>Kennel Assistant:</u> Assist caretakers with duties associated with animal care, such as cleaning cages, filling water bowls, and taking animals out of cages to visit with potential adopters. This job also includes routine maintenance, such as laundry, washing food pans, sweeping, etc. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | 3- <u>Grooming Assistant:</u> Assist caretakers with the grooming of animals at the shelter. Duties include brushing and/or bathing animals, clipping nails and other tasks related to the upkeep of an animal. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | 4- <u>Cat Socialization:</u> Assist in the socialization of cats available for adoption by handling, brushing, speaking softly, and playful contact. Duties also include spot cleaning cages, replacing water, and cleaning litter boxes throughout the day. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | 5- <u>Small Mammal Assistant:</u> Assist caretakers with duties associated with rabbits, guinea pigs, hamsters, and other small mammals. Duties include spot cleaning cages, replenishing water and hay and sweeping around cages. Volunteer also interacts with the public and must have prior experience with small mammals. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | 6- <u>Front Office Assistant:</u> Assist the front office staff with such duties as answering phones, filing animal records, and assisting citizens at the counter with questions regarding adoption policies and other animal issues. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | 7- <u>Events/Tours Assistant:</u> Assist the Volunteer Services Coordinator with guided tours of the Shelter. Duties include providing groups of all ages and numbers with detailed information about the Animal Care and Adoption Center, as well as acting as a representative of ACAC at public events. Volunteers with extroverted personalities are preferred. |
| <input type="checkbox"/> | 8- <u>Adoption Counselor:</u> Assist in the adoption counseling process. Duties include reviewing personality profiles of animals in the Shelter and providing input to the _____ with the goal of properly matching a citizen with a specific animal. Must have good communication skills. |

General Conduct

Volunteers shall be governed by the ordinary and reasonable rules of good conduct and behavior, and as such, will not commit any act that would bring reproach or discredit upon the Virginia Beach Animal Care and Adoption Center or the Animal Enforcement Unit.



- **Courtesy:** Volunteers will be courteous, civil and respectful toward each other and toward all persons having business with the Shelter on all occasions, including personal and telephone contact.
- **Language:** Volunteers will not use inappropriate or insolent language to any employee, volunteer, or visitor of the Shelter.
- **Honesty:** Volunteers will be honest in their dealings with the public and with those involved with the Virginia Beach Animal Care and Adoption Center or the Animal Enforcement Unit.

Reasons for Termination of Agreement

- Cruelty to any animal.
- Gross insubordination, which is the outright refusal to follow directions or obey legitimate orders of supervisors.
- Failure to follow procedures.
- Failure to report problems that may be detrimental to the Virginia Beach Animal Care and Adoption Center or the Animal Enforcement Unit.
- Willful abuse of the building or equipment.
- Threats, intimidation, coercion or interference with employees or volunteers.
- Incompetence or inefficiency where the welfare of an animal, volunteer, staff member, or member of the public is jeopardized.
- Use, sale, and/or purchase of drugs or alcohol.
- Theft or other dishonest acts.
- Failure to report accidents, conflicts or injuries.
- Failure to adhere to privacy policies.
